Pastor: Let us name before God those for whom we offer our prayers this morning:

C: We praise you and thank you, O Lord.

C: We praise you and thank you, O Lord.

P: Lord, grant your healing grace to all who are sick, injured, or disabled, that they may be whole

C: Hear us, O Lord of life.

P: Grant to all who seek your guidance, and to all who are lonely, anxious, or despondent, a knowledge of your will and an awareness of your presence;

C: Hear us, O Lord of life.

P: Mend broken relationships, and restore those in emotional distress to soundness of mind and serenity of spirit;

C: Hear us, O Lord of life.

P: Bless physicians, nurses, and all others who minister to the suffering, granting them wisdom and skill, sympathy and patience;

C: Hear us, O Lord of life.

P: Grant to the dying peace and a holy death, and uphold by the grace and consolation of your Holy Spirit those who are bereaved;

C: Hear us, O Lord of life.

P: Restore to wholeness whatever is broken by human sin in our lives, in our nation, and in the world;

C: Hear us, O Lord of life.

P: You are the Lord who does wonders; You have declared your power among the peoples. With you, O Lord, is the well of life; and in your light we see light.

C: Hear us, O Lord of life.

P: Heal us and make us whole.
